

No Death Penalty for Zolo!

Zolo Azania has been imprisoned on Indiana's DEATH ROW for over 23 years.

His 1982 death sentence was overturned in 1993, because the prosecution withheld favorable evidence, and his court-appointed attorney provided him with ineffective assistance. Zolo was again sentenced to death in 1996, and this sentence, too, was vacated in 2002, because Blacks were systematically excluded from the 1996 jury pool.

Zolo now faces a third sentencing trial - and the state of Indiana wants to kill him! We mustn't let that happen!

Zolo Agona Azania is one of the many persons of African descent who await execution as a victim of a racially biased criminal justice system. Politically active at the time of his arrest, Zolo is committed to the struggle for social justice for all peoples. We say
